PWLTP, fully funded by Prologis, is designed to give young people, the unemployed and those looking to retrain, the opportunity to gain the skills needed to start a career within the logistics sector.

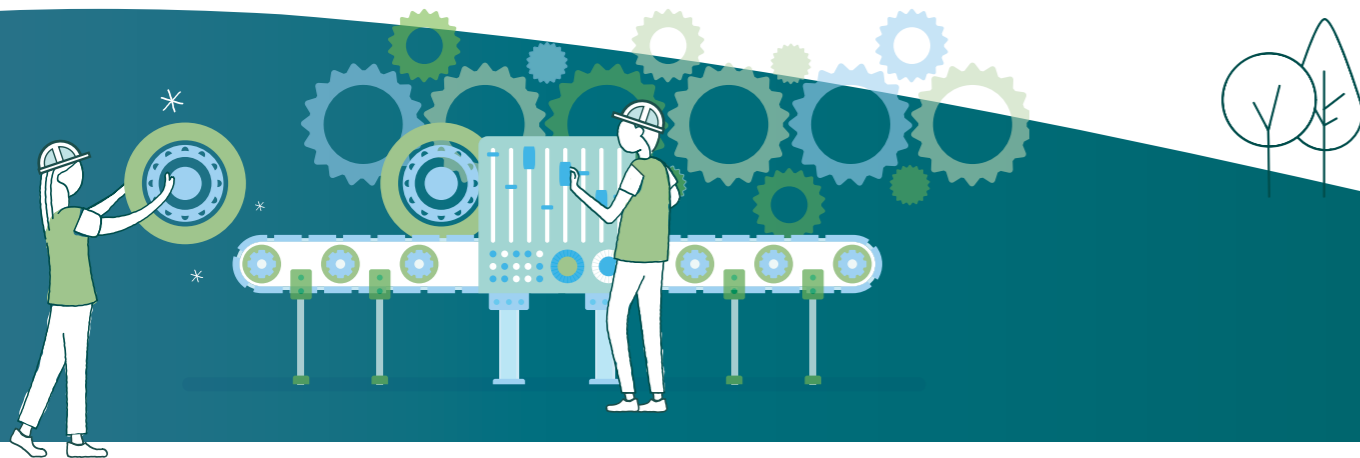


Developing vital skills for the future

In collaboration with training provider Goodwill Solutions, we've built a Warehouse to Wheels programme that provides the knowledge, skills and experience for the role of an LGV Driver (CAT C).

Candidates will not only get practical elements of professional driving as part of their career journey, but also take part in a two-day Resilience into Employability course and Level 2 Introduction to Logistics, which will blend practical and class-based learning.

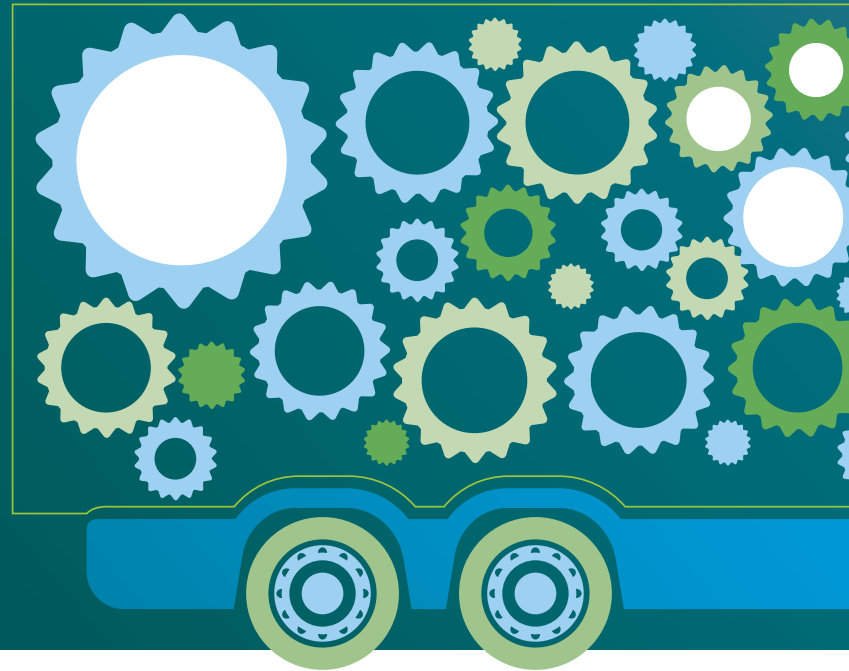
On top of that, candidates will undertake theoretical training – for example on medical, wellbeing and driver competence and receive employment mentoring from logistics learning experts.



What do I do next?

To be eligible, candidates need to completed the Prologis Warehousing and Logistics Training Programme and have successfully pass an interview. The Warehouse to Wheels course lasts for six months, during which time candidates will be placed as a Warehouse operative or Forklift operator with a leading supply chain business.
